HOW TO APPLY HONEYCURE



Step 1

Clean the wound with warm water or saline solution, and pat dry.



Step 2

Apply a thin layer of HoneyCure to the wound and surrounding area.



Step 3

Every 6-12 hours, reapply HoneyCure and redress the wound.

Dry wound healing is when a wound is left open and clean so that a scab can form over. The scab acts as a barrier to the environment and allows the tissue to slowly regrow. This can be itchy for your pet and lead to scar formation.
